Update about Freedom to Speak Up from Linda Cross, Guardian for Derbyshire

I have been in post now for just over a year and it has been an eye-opening year! Due to the increasing number of contacts I have had, The Hub Plus along with Derby and Derbyshire LMC have reinvested funds to support the project for a further year on behalf of Practices. I would like to thank the many individuals and practices who have contacted me for support.

THE FSUG ROLE. The role is a busy one; I am currently holding 24 Freedom to Speak Up cases. Cases range from bullying, to challenging team dynamics. Sadly, staff are impacted by the behaviours they are experiencing and, in some cases, are leaving their practices/PCNs. Colleagues are moving to neighbouring organisations, or even leaving the NHS altogether, which is something we all want to desperately avoid.

So how can we support those who are raising a concern and prevent practices losing staff?

RAISING CONCERNS. When people have tried to raise issues within their own workplaces, they can be met with resistance, mistrust, and in some cases poor treatment which has had an impact on not only their working lives but also their home lives and families. This may be because the person who hears the concern doesn't know what to do with it, or is too busy but in some cases, it is because there is no will deal with the issue/s. Ignoring a FSUG can be incredibly harmful to the individual, leading to their resignation and most importantly, can miss the opportunity to rectify a problem and /or improve patient care.

Sometimes a three-minute conversation acknowledging the concern, thanking the speaker for raising it and letting them know that following an investigation they will receive feedback is just what is needed.

HOW TO UPSKILL. The good news is there are many ways to support you and your staff to raise concerns and deal with any issues raised. There is excellent training on the e-learning For Health website. Speak up for all staff, Listen Up for team leaders, and management, and Follow up for the senior management team.

I am also a resource to help. It is important to know I do not report to other organisations, other than discussing anonymous trends to the National Guardians Office, so they can report on themes and trends. I do not investigate concerns, but I can guide you and provide you the resources and information to help you to improve things for staff and patients in your surgeries.

VALUE THE PROCESS. Every time someone is brave enough to raise a concern it is a gift of information that can help improve service delivery, staff morale, and patient safety. The many practices in Derbyshire that have an open and approachable culture are finding that involving staff in service delivery creates a much more positive place to work. As Jayne Chidgey-Clark, National Guardian for the NHS says: 'When leaders actively listen and take action, it strengthens organisations, and fosters a culture of ongoing improvement and innovation in delivering healthcare.'
